### Early Career Teachers Have a Voice

The BOG has appointed Megan Flowers to chair this important work. Megan is a special education teacher at Colerain ES. She is also chair of the National Education Association's (NEA) Young Professional Caucus. Megan currently serves as her building's Senior Faculty Representative and has been a delegate to the NEA and OEA Representative Assemblies. Megan was recently appointed to serve on the Core Team of the CEA Bargaining Team.

#### **Know Your CEA Secretary: Janet Curtis**

Janet Curtis has been with the district since 2003, teaching



science at Linden McKinley STEM Academy. She has served as her department chair for four years and has been involved in many aspects of her school's programming. She was a member of the SLO team, served as a TBT leader for grade levels 11 and 12, and this year was a volunteer with the high school's blood drive.

In 2015, Curtis served as an alternate Faculty Representative. Last year she had the chance to get involved in the association's broader work. CEA's Dorothy Wilson visited her school and invited her to attend the OEA Summer Academy. Curtis attended and was instantly drawn in by the sense of unity and "the opportunity to meet other teachers, especially other teachers from Columbus City Schools."

Curtis then began participating in several more CEA activities. "When I went with other colleagues to lobby our legislators, that was a whole new experience," she said. "I don't know if I'd ever been in the Statehouse before. We learned how to go about lobbying, how to make a difference. Because your voice is heard and going to meetings around the district you realize there is so much more going on than what's in your building. CEA is such a well-organized association. CEA is on top of things. A lot of the other districts don't have that."

Curtis' main role as the Secretary of CEA's Board of Governors is to record the proceedings of the monthly Legislative Assembly meetings and biweekly Board meetings. Her reports inform the association's central work. Curtis and her teenage daughter live in Genoa Township, where they care for 10 rescue cats and two dogs.

## Social Justice



In 2015 the CEA formed its Social and Economic Justice Committee (SEJC) to address the issues that impact our work outside of the classroom. In 2016 SEJC hosted a CEA Community in Crisis Forum where more than 100 CEA and community members came together to discuss the issue of violence in our neighborhoods. The committee also sponsored an information session on the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) for our members to become informed about the Federal law that would impact their work.

This year the committee has been on hiatus so that CEA could focus on the November election and passing the school levy. The committee is now back to work and held its first meeting on February 28, where members gathered to brainstorm ideas for its upcoming work.

#### A Letter to Our Members

Dear CEA Family:

We are prayerfully requesting an O+ kidney donor for my husband, Daniel Smith. He has been on dialysis for 2 years and 3 months. He is currently on the deceased waiting list at OSU, but it can take up to 3 more years to receive a kidney. A living donation has quicker and better long term results, because every day he waits for a kidney and is on dialysis, it is more detrimental to his life.

In Ohio 3,400 individuals need a life-saving transplant and 18 people die every day waiting for a transplant in the US. Dan is required to receive a direct O+ donor due to having a traumatic lung transplant in December 2015 which caused his kidneys to fail. My children and I do not match his blood type, so we are ineligible to donate. OSU will not even consider us for a paired match.

This is a big request, but we make it knowing there are people who devote every day of their lives to make a difference. If you can help, or if you know someone who can, please call me at (614) 579-7309, or call his transplant co-ordinator at OSU Robin at (614) 293-6737.
