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



## MOY K-2 RIMP Up-Date

On Tuesday, Nov. 20, CEA President John Coneglio and CEA members Jeanette Johnson, Tai Hayden and Michelle Coneglio met with District leaders Alesia Gillison and Machele Kline to continue the conversation about minimizing paperwork due to the state-mandated RIMP. The objective was to eliminate the District requirement for initiating a new RIMP for K-2 students who identified as **ON TRACK** at the BOY who then test **OFF TRACK** at the MOY. After a productive and informative meeting, CEA is pleased to report that the District acknowledges that there are multiple alternative methods for progress monitoring and will **NOT** require a RIMP for those K-2 students who test **OFF TRACK** at the MOY. Meaningful, ongoing dialog has produced a positive outcome for everyone.

## Save The Date

The Columbus Education Association's 40th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Awards Dinner is set for Thursday, Jan. 17, 2019, at the Hyatt Regency Columbus. Tickets are \$35 per person, or \$280 for a table of eight. The MLK Dinner is one of CEA's signature events that honors the memory of Dr. King. During the dinner we present awards to individuals who exemplify the spirit of his work.



The Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Humanitarian Award marks distinguished service in the community in the areas of education, social justice or human and civil rights. Anyone except current employees of the Columbus City Schools is eligible to receive this award. Nominations may come from students, parents, teachers, community leaders, and community residents.

The Helen Jenkins Davis Award is named in honor of the first black teacher hired by the Columbus City Schools. Mrs. Davis, who was hired in 1918, was also the first witness called in the 1976 school desegregation trial in Columbus. The Davis Award is presented annually to a CEA member who has promoted social justice, diversity and human and civil rights.

## Bargaining Priorities Survey Coming Soon

On Friday, Nov. 30, CEA members were sent a link for the on-line-only Bargaining Priorities Survey to their personal email. This survey will close at 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, Dec. 16. For security reasons, members cannot access the survey from a CCS computer or a device connected to the CCS network. If CEA does not have your personal email address, you will not be able to complete the survey online.

Members who do not have a home computer or a non-CCS email address may complete the survey at the CEA office. Office hours are 8:30 a.m.–4:30 p.m., Monday–Friday. ## Co-Curricular Activities and Extra Duties

Section 209.02 of the *CEA Master Agreement* states that full-time bargaining unit members may supervise up to five extracurricular activities that occur outside of the workday each year (examples include, but are not limited to, concerts, athletic events and drama productions).

Administrators should first seek volunteers to supervise the extracurricular duties. If no one volunteers and bargaining unit members must be assigned to supervise, your administrator must provide you with two weeks' notice of such assignment. These extracurricular supervisory assignments should not be longer than three hours in length or extend past the length of a normal school-related evening activity.

Additionally, bargaining unit members cannot be required to sell tickets or handle money in connection with supervisory duties. Bargaining unit members required participation in a September open house does count as one of your five supervisory duties. If you have questions, please call the CEA Office at (614) 253-4731.

## Looking for a Job Share?

Job sharing provides a way for teachers who wish to continue their employment with Columbus City Schools in less than a full-time capacity. Most job shares are a 50/50 split, but other arrangements can take place.

If you would like to job share with another bargaining-unit member, each partner must complete his or her own job-share

packet. The documents must be signed by both job-share partners, as well as the principal or supervisor where the job share is to occur. Once the job-sharing request is approved, the job share cannot be dissolved unless all parties agree (teachers, principals or supervisors and HR). CEA will compile a list of bargaining-unit members who are looking for job-share partners. To add your name to the list, go to <http://bit.ly/2RgMKXd> and fill out the online form. Even if you submitted your name last year, complete the online form again this year. Submit the completed form no later than 11:59 p.m. on Thursday, Dec. 20. On Friday, Dec. 21, a list of potential job-share partners will be emailed to each person completing the online form to assist in finding a job-share partner.

Each partner's completed job-share packet is due to CCS Human Resources, ATTN: Employment and Staffing, no later than 5 p.m., Tuesday, Jan. 15, 2019. Your Association recommends hand delivering these documents and obtaining a time-stamped copy for your records. If you have further questions about job sharing, contact Cindy Love at CEA at (614) 253-4731.

If you are planning to job share and to carry insurance through CCS, the rate you will pay will be significantly higher than what you would pay as a full-time teacher. Contact CCS Human Resources Benefits Department to determine your cost.
