It's your right to call CEA before you respond

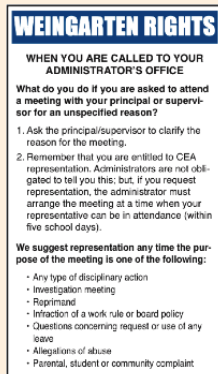
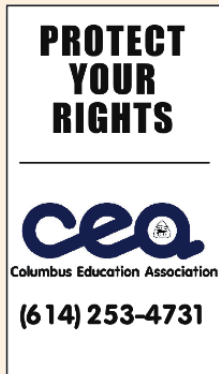
More than thirty years ago, the U.S. Supreme Court protected unionized workers' rights to due process during questioning by a supervisor. This case, *NLRB v. J. Weingarten*, defines what's known as your Weingarten rights. If you are asked to attend a meeting with your principal or supervisor for an unspecified reason, you should exercise these rights.

First, ask the principal or supervisor to clarify the reason for the meeting. You cannot refuse to attend a meeting called by your principal—to do so would be insubordination. However, you should be informed about the purpose of the meeting. If the meeting becomes disciplinary in nature, you are entitled to CEA representation upon your request. (Your principal might not tell you this.) The choice of representative is up to you. This is your right as a bargaining unit member.

Your administrator should never arrange for representation on your behalf. Once you request representation, the administrator must arrange the meeting at a time when your representative can attend. Section 404.01 of the *Master Agreement* provides members with a maximum of five school days to re-schedule the meeting to accommodate the representative. CEA suggests representation any time the purpose of the meeting is one of the following:

- Any type of disciplinary action
- Investigative meeting
- Reprimand
- Infraction of a work rule or board policy
- Questions concerning requests for or uses of leave
- Allegations of abuse

ODE Special Education Survey

The Ohio Department of Education (ODE) is seeking input via online survey and a series of state-wide town hall meetings from educational professionals who work with special education students as the department begins to implement Each Child, Our Future, Ohio's Strategic Plan for Education.

ODE is asking for as many education professionals as possible to complete the survey so that they can learn "which areas the Department should focus on to improve educational outcomes for students with disabilities." SLO Data Entry Deadline Approaches

The SLO Scoring Templates are available in ILEAD for classroom teachers to submit final SLO results. These are the forms you will use to submit the pertinent data and subsequent results at the conclusion of your SLOs. When you log into your ILEAD portal:

- You will find two blank templates listed.
- When you click to open a template, the directions for completion are at the top of the page and the Save and Submit buttons are at the bottom.
- When you have entered all of your data, you must click the submit button to have your results recorded.

Your Association works hard to protect your rights and maintain the integrity of the negotiated contract. While we advise bargaining unit members to work out problems at the building level first, we know this isn't always possible. We will inform you of the grievances CEA is working on for you on a regular basis.

Columbus City Schools' Division of Professional Learning & Licensure is once again partnering with The Ohio State University to offer the CCS/OSU Outreach Courses. Courses are for certificated staff currently employed by Columbus City Schools.

Teachers who meet OSU's requirements and enroll in a course will have all Instructional and General Fees (i.e., tuition) paid. Individuals will be responsible for any additional fees for materials, applying to the OSU Graduate School (if not a prior student), and for the cost of OSU's Tk20 online program (required for all endorsements).

- Consider applying for a **CEA and CEA-R Scholarship**. These competitive scholarships are a wonderful opportunity for our members' children to earn scholarship dollars toward college. **Applications are due at 4:30 p.m., Friday, Mar. 29, 2019.** You can find the application at <http://bit.ly/ceaspringschol2019>. The scholarship application must include a statement of the student's personal philosophy and goals and also include two references. One from a current academic instructor with whom the student has studied during the past year, and one from someone other than a relative. **Applicants must be the children of a CEA or CEA-R member for their dependent(s) to be eligible.**
- Summer School Applications Now Up** – If you would like to teach summer school, now is the time to apply. Find the online-only application at <http://www.columbus.k12.oh.us/summerSchool19>. Eligible applicants must be a full-time certificated/licensed teacher in the district. Article 801 of the *Master Agreement* sets forth the selection criteria for summer school applicants. Although there is no established deadline for completing the teacher summer school application, the goal is to finalize summer staffing prior to spring break. Selections will begin immediately and continue until all positions are filled. **Initial placements will be finalized by Friday, Mar. 22, and applicants will be notified by Apr. 5. Selected teachers will receive a selection agreement by school mail that must be signed and returned by Friday, Apr. 12.**
