Those selected will remain active in the PAR Pool for five years. In addition to submitting a letter of interest and a résumé, each applicant is required to have three letters of reference from the following: current building administrator, current CEA SFR, and a professional reference. You must continue to complete the evaluation process until your retirement has been approved by the Board of Education.
