Know your contract—ABC

By now your Association Building Council, or ABC, should be established and meeting dates set for the entire school year.

The ABC consists of the following members: the Senior Faculty Representative, two elected staff members and two members of the staff selected by the principal, plus one additional elected member and one appointed member selected for every additional twenty teachers on staff. The principal is not a member of the ABC.



The purpose of the ABC is to assist the principal and the school staff in developing policies and programs for the school, including building discipline policies.

ABC meetings are open to all teachers in the building. Review Article 202 of your contract for more information.

Enroll in legal services plan

Donate, borrow sick leave

Each year, some of our colleagues experience devastating illnesses and injuries that require long recovery periods. Many of us would like to assist one another during these times. That's why we have a sick leave bank to which you can donate two days of your sick leave. A needy employee who is a member of the bank may receive as many as 10 donated days.

The donor also benefits. Anyone who has joined the bank by donating at least two sick days, and then exhausts his or her own share of sick days, may take a loan from the bank of up to 10 days.

Remember, the days are a loan. Any sick leave you borrow must be repaid when you leave the district. Any outstanding sick leave will be deducted from your final paycheck.

The enrollment period for the Sick Leave Bank will be the month of September, with membership beginning Oct. 1. We encourage you to donate days and to borrow from the bank if you need it. Bear in mind that if participation in the bank program drops below 10 percent, the program will be canceled. The donation form, along with a detailed description of the plan, is available on the Columbus City Schools and CEA Web sites.

If you joined the Sick Leave Bank last year, you do not need to rejoin, and you do not need to make an additional donation.
