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

ciation, take it seriously." This is retiring CEA Staff Consultant Bob Hern's advice to the membership. He dispensed it after receiving CEA's Distinguished Service Award and the Builder of the Association Award at the **CEA Annual Awards** & Retirement Banquet. The banquet, held May 21 at the



Hyatt Regency Columbus, was the 40th such celebration. This year, CEA honored 21 retiring educators, and paid homage to CEA and community members who have worked tirelessly to benefit our schools, our community and the Association.

Hern received a standing ovation for his many years of service to the Association. Bob was a technology teacher at the Northeast Career Center before joining the CEA staff. His service to CEA has included representing and advising members seeking to protect their rights, serving as staff photographer and designing and managing the Association's print productions.

Courtney Coman received the Outstanding Member Award. Coman taught at Eastgate ES, where she served as an FR before being staff-reduced. Although no longer serving as the FR, Coman still attends all the legislative assembly meetings to stay informed. Despite her reassignment, she remains active with the Association. She is a member of CEA's Minority Involvement Program Committee and its Social and Economic Justice Committee. CEA President Tracey D. Johnson credited Coman, a former charter school teacher, with "understanding what it means to work hard for less" and unhesitatingly staying involved to assure decent pay and working conditions for our members.

The City of Columbus received the Friend of Education Award for its efforts to expand high-quality pre-kindergarten opportunities. Rhonda Johnson, Director of Education for the City of Columbus, praised the city's efforts to increase Pre-K funding to ensure hiring of highly qualified teachers.

provides a health sciences-themed approach providing college-preparatory educational opportunities for students and their parents.
