## A Message from the CEA President

CEA members,

This Tuesday, at the Columbus City Schools Board of Education meeting, we learned that the Administration entered into a \$250,000 contract with a for-profit corporation, Graduation Alliance, Inc., to provide online courses to OUR most vulnerable students. Graduation Alliance was recently acquired by private-equity

giant KKR & Co.—one of the world's top global investment firms with \$471 billion in assets. Graduation Alliance, Inc. has come under fire recently in New Mexico, both for being unable to provide meaningful

proof of their effectiveness in that state as well as the continued employment of a former NRA lobbyist as the company's Vice President of Government Relations who was instrumental in killing "MaKayla's Law," a Tennessee gun safety bill.

The Board Agenda Item states: "Once a student is enrolled in the program, they are assigned courses by Graduation Alliance academic coaches and will take courses asynchronously online. These courses will include online teacher facilitation. An academic coach will assign courses for students and work with them on pace and progress. A local advocate will be assigned to each student for social and emotional support. Students will meet virtually and in-person with their local advocate. Students will also have access to 24x7 tutoring and will be provided with a Google Chromebook with Wi-Fi, if they need a device and Internet connectivity."

This is OUR work.

There is no substitute for the relationships we have with OUR students, OUR students' families and OUR community.

This quarter-million dollar spend is an attack on **OUR job** security and OUR profession.

CEA has filed a Step 2 Grievance in response, as this is a violation of OUR Master Agreement and OUR BlendED MOU in effect for this school year.

This is not the first time we have faced outsourcing of our work. This fall, our grievance regarding outsourcing of Pre-K courses to Waterford Institute will come before an arbitrator. In that case, two BlendEd CEA members were staff reduced when OUR work was outsourced.

It may not be you today, but if we don't stop the Administration from outsourcing OUR work, it WILL be you tomorrow!

We will be bringing language to the table to stop outsourcing during upcoming negotiations, and your bargaining team needs your support to show the Administration that our Bargaining Team speaks for us! #### **OEA Endorses McFee, Rhodes, and** Walters for STRS Board Rita Walters, Robert McFee, and Jeffrey Rhodes The OEA

Board of Directors has endorsed three candidates for the STRS Board. Robert McFee and Jeffrey Rhodes are seeking re-election to the STRS

Board as representatives of active members. Rita Walters is seeking re-election to the Board as a retiree representative. As Board members, each of OEA's endorsed candidates have been dedicated to improving the funding status of the pension plan to make pension benefits more secure for all members. Over the past four years, funding has improved substantially for both the pension and the STRS healthcare plan. The STRS Board is now in a place to act on resumption of the cost-ofliving allowance for retirees coupled with improvements for active teachers.

In early April, ballots will be sent to all STRS members. Active employees, those currently paying into STRS, are eligible to vote in the election for the active member seats. STRS retirees, are eligible to vote in the election for the retiree seat. Below is information on OEA's endorsed candidates.

We are asking for your help gathering signatures on nominating petitions to qualify OEA's endorsed candidates for the ballot.

### **Robert McFee and Jeffrey Rhodes** (active seats)

OEA's endorses candidates for the STRS Board who are proven leaders who are looking out for the best interests of their fellow educators. Robert McFee is a math teacher in the Willoughby-Eastlake City Schools. Jeffrey Rhodes is an industrial education teacher in North

Royalton City Schools. Both have served on the Board since

### Rita Walters (retiree seat)

Schools. As an active teacher she also served as president of her local association and on the OEA Board of Directors for 12 years. Walters was elected to the STRS Board in 2017.
