

Community coalitions, like CEJC, are essential to amplifying our political power, buildings broader support for public education, and addressing complex challenges that affect both students and members.

CEA goes on strike with support of Columbus community, including parents, families, and students.

Community requests to stay together to fight for equity & justice in CCS. Columbus Education Justice Coalition is officially formed.

2023

CEJC campaigns for tax levy issue, canvasses in "low voter turnout" neighborhoods, helps win the levy.

Learns about possible school closings after levy passes. Begins to engage community and focus on board actions.

2025



Focused on common good bargaining, CEJC partners with CEA to include community members as observers in contract negotiations.

Increases work on community schools focus, develops policy to address budget shortfalls while focusing on growth, and school closures as last resort.

CEA receives grant from NEA for
Campaign Institute which is focused
on community schools, common
good bargaining, and building

power. Creates and hires for
Education Justice Organizer position
with OEA support.

CEJC builds city-wide

2024

CEJC works with partner organizations, like All in for Ohio Kids, to build "Our Community, Our Schools" campaign to focus on shared decision-making for school transformation and plans for school growth - not school closings.

Challenges school closing policy and Superintendent's "Community" Task Force. Hosts BBQs at the BOE to get parent, member, community participation at board meetings.

Board vote paused until December. 75% of schools on initial closing list saved. Works with CEA and CCS on community schools model - leads implementation team and selection of Northland HS as pilot school.

Relationships

- The build-up of trusting, ongoing partnerships between Columbus City Schools and the community.
- The inclusion of those most impacted (students, families, educators) in shaping policy and practice.
- Responsive and transparent communication from decision-makers with families, educators, and community members

Reinvestment

- Equitable and fair school funding that channels funds, attention, programmatic innovation, and infrastructure into neighborhood schools and communities that have been marginalized.
- Reimagining and planning for schools as the hub of their neighborhoods, with shared decision-making, wrap-around services, and community-connected planning and learning.

Reconstruction

- Transforming the educational ecosystem of top-down decision making by rebuilding a structure that ensures student, family, community, and staff engagement as shared decision-makers.
- Policy and governance changes that address the root causes of inequity in Columbus City Schools.


